OUR MISSION

Hospice & Palliative Care of Westchester strives to provide extraordinary and dignified comfort, care and compassion to individuals and families facing a serious or life-limiting illness.

Children are one of life's most precious gifts and they deserve the opportunity to live each and every day to its fullest. When a child is diagnosed with a progressive, life-limiting illness, the entire family faces many challenges. Pediatric palliative care provides these children and their families with the support and care they need to continue to enjoy life.

Unlike traditional hospice and palliative care for adults, parents can keep their child on a curative treatment plan when beginning palliative care services.

An individualized plan of care is developed for each child and the palliative care team works with the many social groups in a child's life. These may include family, friends, neighbors, teachers and sports teams. Serving as a communications liaison for these groups, the palliative care team allows the child to maintain as normal a life as possible. It is through this teamwork that the care offered fulfills the physical, psychosocial, social and spiritual needs of the child and their family. At the same time the plan of care remains sensitive to developmental, personal, cultural and religious values. This collaborative approach to care takes a significantly larger amount of time, energy and resources than traditional hospice and palliative care for adults.

In 2011, Hospice & Palliative Care of Westchester (HPCW), with more than 20 years of experience serving the community, began examining the level of pediatric palliative care available in Westchester County. According to the Westchester County Bureau of Statistics, 94 deaths of children age 0-21 took place in Westchester County in 2010 with 82 of the 94 deaths a result of life-limiting disease or neurological conditions.

Calling upon local healthcare providers, HPCW began discussing services that were then available to parents and caregivers. After more than a year of discussions, research and countless meetings it was determined there was a significant need for increased pediatric palliative care in the community and HPCW began developing a pediatric palliative care program they have recently named "Comfort Crew".

Comfort Crew is a specially trained team that includes pediatricians, nurses, social workers, spiritual care coordinators, home health aides, volunteers, expressive therapists, and grief and bereavement counselors. The team works with the child's own medical team to create a plan melding any curative treatments the patient is undergoing along with palliative care to create the best prognosis and highest quality of life for the patient and the greatest level of comfort and support available for the child and their family.


the hundreds of long-submerged coins. Through this joint community effort, HPCW received the donation of more than \$900.

Throughout our 21 year history, the dedicated professionals and volunteers at Hospice & Palliative Care of Westchester (HPCW) have

sought to meet the needs of an ever changing community by continually improving and expanding our programs and services.

Now in 2013, we continue to re-define end-of-life care in Westchester County by enhancing the care provided to our patients and their families with our newly expanded pediatric palliative care program, appropriately named Comfort Crew. This journey leading to the creation of Comfort Crew began a little more than a year ago when we began to examine the need for pediatric palliative care in our community.

We organized several roundtable discussions and meetings with acute care providers in the region including Maria Fareri Children's

Hospital, Elizabeth Seton Pediatric Center, Memorial Sloan Kettering, Blythedale Children's Hospital and pediatric oncologists. These vital conversations led to a realization of the significant shortage of pediatric palliative care in Westchester County. As a result, we are in the process of expanding Hospice & Palliative Care of Westchester's pediatric palliative care program. This will allow us the opportunity to work in conjunction with area facilities to better meet the needs of this special population.

Palliative Care for a child differs greatly from the services we provide to adults. Experts in this unique type of care, the staff of Comfort Crew, have been specially educated in this field. Four of our Comfort Crew staff members recently attended a "train the trainer" program and are now certified to educate staff at other organizations throughout New York State.

As we enhance our services for patients, we must be cognizant of the financial impact recent government cuts are having in our local community. Sequestration, the

mandatory cuts to Federal agencies, went into effect on April 1. Many are unaware of the impact these cuts have on our HPCW's bottom line. Hospice & Palliative Care of Westchester remains dedicated to its mission. It is important to note that we will continue to maintain our exceptional level of care and will not allow sequestration to impact services to our hospice patients and their families. These losses, however, require us to be ever more dependent on the generosity of our supporters.

When I consider the changes 2013 has brought and those still to come, I want to extend my deepest gratitude to our dedicated Board of Directors and to our exceptional staff who every day celebrate and exemplify our mission. I would also like to thank the Westchester community and our donors and supporters for the essential role they play in our continued success. It is through this combined effort that we remain the "Hospice of Choice" in Westchester County.


